Professor Vivienne Nathanson (Director of Professional Activities, British Medical Association)	Medical ethics in relation to fitting for detention, questioning and interrogation; medics' broader duties towards prisoners.
Dr Jason Payne-James (Forensic Physician)	Medics' duties to those in custody. Appropriateness of medic certifying detainee as "fit for questioning".
Dame Anne Owers DBE (formerly HM Chief Inspector of Prisons)	Safer custody; good practice in custodial standards.
Professor Brice Dickson (Professor of International and Comparative Law at Queen's University, Belfast; Director of the School of Law's Research Cluster in Human Rights and Director of the School of Law's Human Rights Centre)	Human rights considerations; sight deprivation in cases of torture and abuse.
Professor Sir Adam Roberts KCMG FBA (President of the British Academy, Senior Research Fellow in International Relations at Oxford University and Emeritus Fellow of Balliol College, Oxford)	International humanitarian law – operational security measures in detention situations.
